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Budget sub-committee update:

 The budget sub-committee can make spending decisions on requests under \$1,000. Requests over \$1,000 need to be voted on at School Council.

Funding Requests for Review:

- Reach for the Top. \$825. In early March, we participated in a regional Reach for the Top tournament at Upper Canada College to attempt to qualify for the provincial finals. During this tournament, we faced off against many of Toronto's strongest trivia schools, such as UCC, Marc Garneau Collegiate Institute, and others. We tied for the best record at the tournament and qualified for the provincial finals for the first time since 2019. We are looking forward to competing in the provincial finals to demonstrate Northern's high academic prowess and to cement its reputation as the top notch school that it is. We hope to send 5 players to the provincial tournament. The tournament takes place in Toronto over the weekend of May 4-5th. Reach for the Top has set the price to attend the tournament at \$165 per person, which is why we are requesting \$825. (Supported with \$413 last year)
- **Squash Team. \$600.** Funds will be used for entry fee for a tournament and squash t-shirt. 24 students involved.
- **STEM Alumni Panel. May 8**th. Funding for refreshments/light snacks for Meet & Greet/Mix & Mingle. Perhaps help with purchasing.
- Buddies Retreat. A 3-day (2-night) leadership training and community building trip to Camp Wahanowin for approximately 60 buddies for the 2024-25 school year. The funds will be used to subsidize the cost of the trip for the students, making it more accessible. The trip currently costs \$316 per person and would like that to be in the range of \$225-\$250 as it was \$215 last year. Total cost is \$24300. Received \$5400 to date. (Supported with \$1500 last year)
- Connecting with Your Teen Workshop. Pizza for student helpers.

Expected Funding

- Grade 12 Academic Excellence. \$400
- Teacher Staff Social. Last year was \$800
