Co-chair Report – John B.

- November 16 Paul Davis event attendance 185; contact information and links were sent to attendees after the event.
- School statement of needs: being reviewed.
- TDSB long-term program and accommodation strategy was referenced, which includes changes to legacy boundaries for Northern. More details are <u>here</u>.

Principal's Report – Adam M.

- Principal gave an overview of matters that were covered in the recent PA day: a social worker will provide mandatory training; clarification of school constitution; discussed staff sponsor and what is involved; external speaker presentation.
- Discussed upcoming events: United Way fashion show Nov 30 and Dec 1; Grade 8 open house December 12.
- Washrooms:
 - NSS is hoping to overhaul all bathrooms to provide more all-gender stalls, fully frame all toilet stalls, and install cameras in shared areas of the washrooms. Suggested we become a pilot school to move this forward, after consultation with all stakeholders.
 - A parent asked how vaping in washrooms is being managed for example, having vape detectors. These are not standard TDSB practice but the principal will see if we could be a pilot in this way as well.
 - Thought being given to the need for separated (male/female) washrooms versus all-gender washrooms where there is a shared space with sinks and mirrors.
- Room 137 will hopefully be ready for use in semester 2 (just waiting for HVAC system). Three more rooms will overhauled over summer to create new teaching spaces.
- Staffing massive issue in every unit of the Board all areas and all over the province. This is why parents may have noticed staffing changes and challenges recently. Planning is in process for semester 2 staffing - hoping to get done before January.
- Carry over of funds: this year, TDSB has changed the rules and will claw back all unspent funds that each school has received each year, except for 25%. This creates planning problems and may result in the school exhausting funds faster than in the past. (the school may ask parents for additional fundraising). NSS's TDSB operating budget is \$409,000 and must be spent on specific items – curriculum, facilities etc.
- "Ask Adam":
 - Does NSS have a Caring Adult program? Yes, mostly focuses on Grade 9. Staff contacts: April Vibert, Dan Gana
 - What kind of mental health supports are provided? We are educators, not mental health experts, so the school relies on partners – social worker, youth worker, etc. School-wide programs right now comprise the NSS Wellness group; Lumenus will be in building by the end of the month and the principal will ask them to look at providing a program that can reach more students.
 - Spectators at offsite sports can students and parents watch? There has been a drastic reduction in sports managers in TDSB, from 15 to 3, which has changed how games have been managed. A new event management protocol means that staff from each school must be on site if there are spectators, so staff commitments mean that not all offsite games will be able to accommodate NSS spectators.
 - New date for job/volunteer fair will be announced in an upcoming bulletin.
 - Update on hate crimes and defaced washrooms: three of five washrooms have been repainted – waiting for TDSB to send painters to finish the work. Some of the newly painted washrooms will be closed in order to carefully manage access and prevent further defacing.
 - Semester 1 exam schedule will be posted soon will be a four-day cycle.

Council Business

- Approval of October minutes. Motion to approve: Jen A.; seconded Jessica M.; carried.
- Filling two vacant seats on council: Beth Lauer and Janice Barnett resigned. The chairs thanked them both for their contributions. Two candidates were discussed; the Elections committee will be consulted, and appointments will be announced at the next meeting.

<u> Treasurer's Report – Jen A.</u>

- Council aims to carry \$2,000 over from year to year we have \$5,100 left over from last year. Fundraising campaign closed on November 17 and raised \$10,100 (28% down from last year). This year, we have about \$13,000 to spend. It was agreed to extend the current fundraising campaign by 2 weeks to raise more money.
- Recent grants include renewing the website, and academic awards \$1,400.
- Grant requests over \$1,000 requiring council approval:
 - o \$2,500 girls' volleyball for costs associated with exhibition games (40 students involved). \$500 was suggested agreed.
 - o Over \$1,000 Robotics club for expenses associated with competition. Club was asked to assess budget and come back with a request to council.
- Ideas were discussed to raise more money: extend fundraising by two weeks; do an additional campaign in spring; plan to grant smaller amounts to more clubs; plan to focus efforts on something big every few years. Discussion about offering tax receipts for donations through School Cash Online – a subcommittee will explore this possibility.
