Operational Matters

- Wrapped up business for past school year. Submitted business report for disbursements for past year. Co-chairs reviewed parent engagement and support.

Principal's Report – Adam M.

- Parents are encouraged to send in questions to nss.school.council@gmail.com before each council meeting, for the Principal to answer in the meeting.
- Annual Activity fee: \$60 – typical cost. This covers students printing in the library, the yearbook and the Student Activity Council (SAC), which is an elected student council that administers the funds to fund proposals from teams and clubs at Northern.
- Attendance: in the spring, this year's attendance was projected at 1,935 – it's at 2,058 now. There are 561 Grade 9 students (projected 503), and this was the biggest adjustment in numbers (this is normal, as we have 30 feeder schools). There were also 90 Gifted students instead of the 80 expected. The school is allocated staff based on



projected numbers but until school actually starts, no changes can be made. As of September 21, 3 additional staff have been allocated (now 110 teachers on staff).

- Gifted Program Lead - Monique Cipollone is on mat leave. Interim lead is a new teacher, John Moyer, working with Jessica Pearson - VP; permanent lead will be confirmed soon.
- Kristin Beach, new staff, focus on student leadership.
- Room 137 – status: this is a new fitness studio and is expected to be ready in December (not this month as projected).
- School safety – discussed recent incident re: Snapchat threat – no credible threat confirmed.
 - Other questions:
 - Do families receive a yearbook even if they don't pay for it? They hopefully will, although it depends how much is received from all other families to compensate.
 - With increased enrolment, will more gifted classes open up? There will be no new unique gifted courses added, but all students will get their required courses.

Treasurer's Report – Jen A.

- Last year, Council had enough funding to support lots of clubs, staff and parent engagement; this was because we had two years' of spending to use due to lack of activity during Covid.
- Clubs and teams ask SAC (Student Activities Council) for funding first, then ask School Council for additional funding if needed.
- The 2023/24 year has started with \$5K available (intentionally left over from last year) but will settle back into a more typical budget of about \$12K.
- By the end of September, an email will be sent out asking for voluntary contributions to fund School Council; the target will be around \$15K (pre-Covid we annually received about \$20K).
